Preamble:

Studying the morphology of wars and their impact on food security and food crises is one of the most important trends that guarantees the creation of intellectual, realistic, and proactive strategies that determine for us the proactive perception of the variables that control finding ways to effectively plan for the future in order to endure the ontological security of states through survival and continuity in achieving food self-sufficiency and food security.

The Russian-Ukrainian war between two major food producers has confirmed that food and food supplies have become the main security issue for future security strategies, especially since the ability to produce food is declining in many parts of the world, which constitutes an entry point for the dynamics of conflict.

On the other hand, the restrictions imposed on Ukrainian grain exports have effected global food supplies and led to rising prices, resulting in the relative and complete collapse of the food system within countries in some cases.

How has the Russian-Ukrainian war affected global food supplies, and what are the future scenarios for ensuring the confrontation of the threat of war to food security at the global level?
